SOUTH WALES Sunday 18th November 1962

A memorable day – my first ever WLS Trip. Steam still reigned supreme at the end of 1962 although the two principal passenger engine sheds (Cardiff Canton & Landore) had both closed for rebuilding as diesel depots. Canton's allocation had been sent to a re-opened Cardiff East Dock shed but permit difficulties prevented a visit to this shed.

It was a cold and dark early morning start and it was just getting light as we arrived at Hereford Shed (86C):
